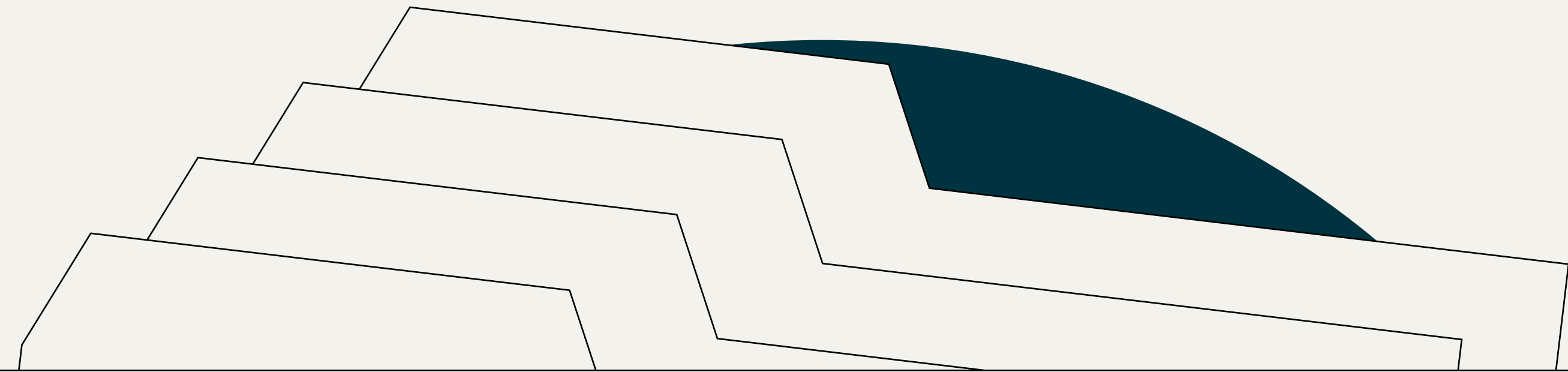

The Enablers of Putin's War

Compiled by Alexei Navalny's Anti-Corruption Foundation – experts on Putin's regime and the corruption networks on which it rests

Aimed at the regime's soft spots to drive a wedge between Putin and his officials

Includes 18 main categories of individuals from key cogs in the system to high-ranking officials, including lists for priority sanctioning of the main warmongers who still escape the attention of the competent authorities

Subject to revision and updates through a transparent procedure

Focused on isolating Vladimir Putin by making association with him toxic and costly



Pillars of Putin's War Regime:

Who Are the 6,000?

Advocates

responsible for spreading propaganda to make Russians believe they are supporting a “special operation” to liberate Ukrainian civilians from a “Nazi Regime”

Unlike Putin's inner circle, most of these people would definitely feel the impact of targeted sanctions

The majority of the people on the list are not billionaires or high-ranking officials, but key cogs in the system with a relatively humble (compared to Putin's top officials) appetite for corruption.

Travel bans and targeted sanctioning of their limited assets abroad will be extremely painful and therefore effective measures for this category of people.

They need a way out

The people on this list fit the criteria of EU, UK and US sanctions regulations against corrupt officials, violators of human rights and warmongers.

The list is subject to revision and updates: many of the 6,000 people, who have no blood on their hands, still have an opportunity to get off the list through active repentance.

A public repudiation or rejection of the aggression against Ukraine is one of the main paths to being removed from the lists.

Why Would the 6,000 List Work?



Targeting these 6,000 individuals will weaken Putin's regime

In preparing this list, the Anti-Corruption Foundation has made use of its decades of experience investigating Putin's corruption and Russian politics, its agents and practices, and knowledge of the regime's vulnerabilities and soft spots.

They can have a future beyond Putin

The median age of the listed individuals is 45 — a flight risk with a chance for a “life after Putin” and no reason to sink along with him. Being put on the list forces them to jump ship, and their exodus accelerates the collapse of the regime.

Sanctioning these people will help make association with Vladimir Putin toxic, leaving him abandoned and isolated in a scorched field

In promoting the 6,000 List, ACF emphasizes that sanctions policies should follow the strategic aim of splitting the elites. Those who value their assets in Europe and the prospect of a peaceful retirement after Putin more than their current criminal role must be made to realize that it is not only the upper echelons of the political elite who will fall under sanctions.

Sanctions regimes are currently set up in such a way that, once sanctioned, individuals have no available exit strategy. The ACF 6,000 List is a publicly declared threat of sanctions, which can be avoided by following clear and transparent criteria: a public condemnation of war and active repentance.

How Would the 6,000 List Work?

The ACF sanctions lists are a kind of purgatory for warmongers, putting them on notice but leaving them opportunity for redemption.

This investigative work will further serve as supporting evidence for the doubtless-forthcoming international war tribunal and other truth-finding proceedings covering the war in Ukraine and Vladimir Putin's other crimes.
