According to reliable data from public investigations, he is implicated in financial manipulation and corruption in Russia.</p> <p>Trusted representative of presidential candidate Vladimir Putin. Trusted representatives ensured the re-election of Vladimir Putin, who has pursued an aggressive policy against Ukraine since 2014, in the non-competitive presidential election on March 18, 2018.</p>
2	Litvinenko Vladimir Stefanovich Литвиненко Владимир Стефанович 1955/08/14 male	<p>A close acquaintance of Russian President Vladimir Putin since the 1990s. Litvinenko chaired a scientific council where the future president defended his doctoral dissertation. In 2000, 2004, 2012, and 2018, Litvinenko headed Putin's campaign headquarters in St. Petersburg.</p> <p>He is a Russian oligarch who controls a large stake (about 20%) in the company "PhosAgro" (a Russian chemical holding, one of the world leaders in the production of phosphorus-containing fertilizers). According to reliable information, the accumulation of capital is due to Litvinenko's close relationship with Vladimir Putin. After the start of the war, Litvinenko seeks to conceal ownership of assets by transferring them to nominal owners, including his wife. Amid the war, he remains involved in the system of Russian political corruption, in which capital is an instrument for acquiring political influence, and political influence is a condition for preserving capital, at the highest level.</p> <p>Member of the Board of Directors of PJSC Rosneft Oil Company.</p> <p>Trusted representative of presidential candidate Vladimir Putin. Trusted representatives ensured the re-election of Vladimir Putin, who has pursued an aggressive policy against Ukraine since 2014, in the non-competitive presidential election on March 18, 2018.</p> <p>Trusted representative of presidential candidate Vladimir Putin in the non-competitive presidential election on March 15-17, 2024. Trusted representatives voluntarily campaign for the re-election of Vladimir Putin, who is responsible for unleashing an aggressive war against Ukraine and political repression in Russia.</p> <p>Rector of St. Petersburg State Mining University. Signed an open letter of university rectors expressing support for the decision of the President of Russia to launch a military operation against Ukraine.</p>

Involved in corruption schemes, profiting from marriage with the ex-wife of Vladimir Putin.</p>
4	<p>Ragimov Ilgam Mamedgasanovich Рагимов Ильгам Мамедгасанович</p> <p>1951/12/14</p> <p>male</p>	<p>A classmate and a friend of Putin. Financed the construction of Putin's palace in Gelendzhik at an estimated cost of 1.3 billion dollars.</p>
5	<p>Zelensky Igor Anatolievich Зеленский Игорь Анатольевич</p> <p>1969/07/13</p> <p>male</p>	<p>Son-in-law of Vladimir Putin, husband of Putin's daughter Yekaterina Tikhonova, with whom they have a child. Benefits materially from close ties to Vladimir Putin, using funds derived from corruption. Igor Zelensky secures funding for cultural project development via the "National Cultural Heritage" fund, a venture initiated directly by Vladimir Putin. Thanks to connections with the family of the President of Russia, the "National Cultural Heritage" fund receives donations of approximately \$2 billion (120 billion rubles) from the state-controlled company "Rosneftgaz". Zelensky also publicly expresses support for Vladimir Putin's policies.</p>

Sponsor of political and media projects at the behest of the head of the State Corporation "Rostec."</p>

7	Agalarov Araz Iskender Агаларов Араз Искендер Оглы 1955/11/08 male	Russian oligarch. He receives significant state contracts through corrupt means and serves as an agent for Vladimir Putin's foreign policy. Amid the war, he remains involved in the system of Russian political corruption, in which capital is an instrument for acquiring political influence, and political influence is a condition for preserving capital, at the highest level.
8	Anisimov Vasily Vasilievich Анисимов Василий Васильевич 1951/09/19 male	Russian oligarch. In 2023, with a fortune of \$1.6 billion, he was placed 72nd in the Forbes ranking. In early 2024, he renounced Russian citizenship (he is a citizen of Croatia and Dominica now). He is a trusted person for Vladimir Putin. This is evidenced by the data from public investigations, according to which he was entrusted with the right to produce vodka under the name of Vladimir Putin (Putinka), the proceeds from the sale of which were used to finance individuals close to the authorities, including Vladimir Putin's mistress Alina Kabaeva. The fact that his influence is still maintained is evidenced by Vladimir Putin's decision to award Vasily Anisimov a state award in October 2022, after he renounced his Russian citizenship (September 2022). Vasily Anisimov's foreign assets may be used to finance individuals close to Vladimir Putin and to promote Russian interests. Amid the war, he remains involved in the system of Russian political corruption, in which capital is an instrument for acquiring political influence, and political influence is a condition for preserving capital, at the highest level.
9	Avdolyan Albert Alikovich Авдолян Альберт Аликович 1970/11/08 male	Russian businessman. Main assets: A-Property company, Elga Coal Company, New House Fund, Yakut Fuel and Energy Company. Founder of the Yota company. The personal wallet of Sergey Chemezov, who controls the state corporation "Rostec" - a key company for the Russian defense industry. Amid the war, he remains involved in the system of Russian political corruption, in which capital is an instrument for acquiring political influence, and political influence is a condition for preserving capital, at the highest level.

10	Kozitsyn Andrey Anatolievich Козицын Андрей Анатольевич	Russian oligarch, mining and metallurgical magnate, former member of the Legislative Assembly of the Sverdlovsk Oblast from the United Russia party.
	1960/06/09	In 2023, Andrey Kozitsyn ranked 30th on Forbes' "110 Russian Billionaires" list with a fortune of \$4.7 billion. He owns stakes in the Ural Mining and Metallurgical Company and UMMC-Holding, and is a co-owner of the railway transportation company "Coal-Trans," as well as the coal mining company "Kuzbassrazrezugol." He finances Russia's aggressive war against Ukraine by participating in the activities of companies that generate significant revenue for the Russian government and operate in key sectors of the Russian economy. The companies in which he is a co-owner supply raw materials and components for the Russian defense industry. In 2023, he received gratitude from Vladimir Putin for his contribution to the work of the All-Russian public-state organization "Russian Military-Historical Society" - an important organization for the Russian authorities, which brings together ideologists of the political regime and Vladimir Putin's policies. Amid the war, he remains involved in the system of Russian political corruption, in which capital is an instrument for acquiring political influence, and political influence is a condition for preserving capital, at the highest level.

Companies associated with him supply equipment and materials, and provide services to the Russian defense industry. He actively finances the ruling party "United Russia" through specially created funds. Amid the war, he remains involved in the system of Russian political corruption, in which capital is an instrument for acquiring political influence, and political influence is a condition for preserving capital, at the highest level.

He provides services to the current political regime, ensuring control over the media space. He is an Israeli citizen, whose business interests remain in Russia. Amid the war, he remains involved in the system of Russian political corruption, in which capital is an instrument for acquiring political influence, and political influence is a condition for preserving capital, at the highest level.

Paid a bribe to the then Deputy Prime Minister of Russia Alexander Khloponin in the form of the sale of real estate in Italy. Khloponin supervised subsoil use, and Prokhorov's business interests lie in this very sphere. Amid the war, he remains involved in the system of Russian political corruption, in which capital is an instrument for acquiring political influence, and political influence is a condition for preserving capital, at the highest level.</p>
14	<p>Shelkov Mikhail Evgenyevich Шелков Михаил Евгеньевич</p> <p>1968/05/30</p> <p>male</p>	<p>Russian oligarch. The owner and deputy chairman of the board of directors of "VSMPO-Avisma" - the world's largest producer of titanium, which is strategically important for the defense industry. He is a beneficiary of Russia's invasion of Ukraine. After the start of the war, he bought the Samara plant for the production of aluminum semi-finished products at a discounted price from the company Arconic, which left Russia. Enterprises owned by Mikhail Shelkov are suppliers to the defense industry in aviation, missile production, and shipbuilding. He finances Russia's aggressive war against Ukraine through participation in the activities of companies that generate significant revenue for the Russian government and operate in key sectors of the Russian economy. According to media reports, he has close ties to Sergei Chemezov, the head of the state corporation "Rostec" (which combines the most important defense assets) and is close to Vladimir Putin.</p>
15	<p>Trotsenko Roman Viktorovich Троценко Роман Викторович</p> <p>1970/09/12</p> <p>male</p>	<p>Russian oligarch. Chairman of the Board of Directors of the Aeon Corporation, which manages airports, ports, and real estate. The group also includes the Kemerovo-based company "Azot," which produces ammonia nitrate. The chemical industry enterprises controlled by him supply raw materials for the Russian defense industry complex. Former advisor to the president of the state company Rosneft Игорь Сечин. Assisted Artem Chayka in the illegal takeover of Verkhnelenskoe River Shipping Company. Amid the war, he remains involved in the system of Russian political corruption, in which capital is an instrument for acquiring political influence, and political influence is a condition for preserving capital, at the highest level.</p>

Manages a regional state body of the Russian Federation that supports or implements actions or policies that undermine or threaten the territorial integrity, sovereignty and independence of Ukraine. According to open sources, the Birjukov family owns apartments and offices worth a total of 4.3 billion rubles (\$61 million), cars worth a total of 176 million rubles (\$2.5 million), and a summer residence worth 1 billion rubles (\$15 million). All the mentioned property is considered illegal enrichment.
17	Borisov Yuri Ivanovich Борисов Юрий Иванович 1956/12/31 male	One of the key leaders of the Russian defense industry in terms of missile weapons and satellite systems. Director General of the State Corporation "Roscosmos", member of the Board of Directors of JSC Concern VKO "Almaz-Antey", member of the Board of Directors of JSC Tactical Missiles Corporation (KRTV), Chairman of the Board of Directors of JSC GLONASS. Involved in illegal enrichment due to large-scale embezzlement in the space sector and at enterprises of the defense industry complex under his control.
18	Bukaev Gennady Ivanovich Букаев Геннадий Иванович 1947/09/15 male	General director of Rosneftegaz (the person exercises the powers of the sole executive body), member of the Board of Directors of JSC ROSNEFTEGAZ. JSC ROSNEFTEGAZ is a state-owned company managing assets in the oil and gas industry (owner of a controlling stake in Rosneft, significant stakes in Gazprom, and Inter RAO). Due to his position, Gennady Bukaev participates in the state's control over key sources of revenue for the Russian budget. Former boss and close friend of Mikhail Vladimirovich Mishustin, who is a Chairman of the Government of the Russian Federation.

Participates in concealing the illegal enrichment of her partner Alexei Miller. Beneficiary of corruption schemes involving PJSC Gazprom and its subsidiaries.

Despite not currently holding top positions in the formal hierarchy of Russian power, he remains part of the political elite and is closely connected to senior officials through his own contacts and through his wife, Tatiana Golikova, who will retain her position as deputy chairman of the Russian government. According to Alexei Navalny's investigation, Viktor Khristenko benefits significantly from corruption schemes involving the supply of medicines, in which Tatiana Golikova and Russian pharmaceutical oligarch Viktor Kharitonin are involved.</p>

Manages a regional state body of the Russian Federation, which supports or implements actions or policies that undermine or threaten the territorial integrity, sovereignty and independence of Ukraine.</p> <p>Was involved in and financially benefitted from corruption schemes designed to provide corrupt sources of income to politicians and government officials and their families. The widow of his late son Irek, Antonia Guishard, owns real estate and businesses in Switzerland; his sister-in-law Venera Gafarova owns real estate in France and Malta (and has Maltese citizenship)</p> <p>Member of the Supreme Council and the Bureau of the Supreme Council of the United Russia party. United Russia forms and implements Vladimir Putin's policy of aggression against territorial integrity, sovereignty and independence of Ukraine.</p>

He enjoyed Vladimir Putin's patronage throughout his tenure as President of Russia as a reward for his efforts in promoting Vladimir Putin's candidacy to the highest state position. In particular, Anatoly Chubais was appointed as the CEO of the State Corporation "Russian Corporation of Nanotechnologies" and held this position from 2008 to 2020.

	male	Despite the company's losses, rampant corruption, and inefficiency, Anatoly Chubais remained its leader, deriving corrupt income from his position. After leaving "RUSNANO," Anatoly Chubais held positions in the management of AFK "Sistema," owned by oligarch Vladimir Yevtushenkov, who is close to Vladimir Putin. Concurrently with his work at AFK "Sistema," Anatoly Chubais held the position of the President's Special Representative for International Organizations until the end of March 2022. Following the onset of the Russian military invasion of Ukraine, he did not publicly condemn Vladimir Putin's actions, despite personally contributing to his rise to power and bolstering his regime for more than two decades.

Was involved in and financially benefitted from corruption schemes designed to provide corrupt sources of income to politicians and government officials and their families. Fradkov's office manages acquisition of subsidized housing for needy federal civil servants. In reality, most of the properties are provided (and heavily subsidized) to wealthy, prominent government officials and their family members, in violation of anti-corruption regulations.</p>
